This workshop was founded in 2010 by a husband and wife, both artists who were studying Plastic Arts at the School of Fine Arts of Toluca; through their platform, they aimed to empower female artists and other traditionally marginalized voices. In addition to the engravings, this collection includes texts in Spanish, Náhuatl, and Braille. This copy is part of a limited run of 30.



This powerful collection of 30 linoleum engraving prints captures the struggles that have occurred in the 30 years since the uprising of the Zapatista Army of National Liberation (EZLN). The title, "What are they going to forgive us for?" is based on the Zapatistas' response to the Mexican State, on January 18, 1994, when it declared amnesty, or forgiveness, toward the group. In a statement at the time, the Insurgent Subcommander Marcos asked, "What do we have to apologize for? What are they going to forgive us for? Of not starving to death? Do not remain silent in our misery? Of having taken up arms when we found all other roads closed? Of being mostly indigenous? Of calling the Mexican people to fight in every possible way for what belongs to them? Of fighting for freedom, democracy, and justice?" This portfolio intends to honor this incredulous reaction and continue fanning the flames of the subcommander's righteous anger. The work was conceptualized by the Taller de Gráfica Felipe Hernández and carried out by 30 artists (15 men and 15 women) from workshops and collectives from throughout Mexico, including Hijo de la

Luna Gráfica, Laboratorio Gráfico 7 Vidas, Taller de Gráfica Nahual, and Taller de Estampa Venus Gráfica. It also includes a credit sheet and a presentation sheet by Cristina Hijar.

The images in this portfolio depict each of these six Friday celebrations, as well as the Holy Friday and Easter Sunday celebrations. Sánchez Santamaría designed, cut, and printed each scene at his studio in Tlayacapan.

Picheta was a prolific satirical engraver and social critic who worked for the Yucatecan newspaper Bullebulle. He is considered the precursor of Posada and, along with him, the most important Mexican engraver of the 19th century. These engravings, which are printed on Chinese paper, are in excellent condition. The original box has been preserved; however, this copy lacks a portrait of the artist by Emilio Vera Granados, which originally came with it. This is folder number 39 in a limited run of 200.





Mexico: Impresiona Seriográfico Hesketh, S. A., 1980. First edition. Six photographs printed on Agfa Brovira paper, each of which measures approximately 22 x 15 cms. These have been mounted on acid-free Fabriano paper and matted (this part has been signed by the photographer), measuring 40 x 30 cm; there is also a notebook that measures 28 x 38 cm.

This is a rare portfolio of six original photographs by renowned Mexican photographer Pedro Meyer, all of which are signed and numbered; the work also features texts by writer and scholar Katya Mandoki and designs by Rafael Davidson. Each photograph was personally developed by Meyer, ensuring they remained unaltered. These distinctive images explore and honor the exquisite beauty and diversity of shapes and textures that are hidden in the depths of the ocean. In the book, Mandoki notes Meyer's great capacity for perception and skill in translating it visually for the discerning eye, saying "What is observed in these images is the definition of a habitable space, the refuge of small marine animals ... thanks to Meyer's photography these shapes change dimension and allow us to perceive them on a human scale. We are surprised to see the enormous similarity that exists between marine architecture and human architecture; let us remember the El Caracol observatory in Chichen Itzá or the vaults of the Alhambra and the Guggenheim Museum in New York." In addition to his pioneering work as a photographer, Meyer has worked as a documentary

filmmaker and cultural promoter who, along with Raquel Tibol, founded the Mexican Council of Photography.

This collection, which was originally prepared for the Banco del Atlántico, is complete and in very good condition, with its original packaging. It is copy number 41 in a limited run of 230. There are no copies on WorldCat.

14. WIRIKUTA PRINT COLLECTION Multiple artists

This is an extensive, rare art portfolio produced in solidarity with antimining activists who have organized around attempts to seize lands held sacred by the Huichol people. The contested territory is in the Sierra De Catorce, in the Mexican state of San Luis Potosi. The Huicholes believe that if the mining companies invade the sacred lands of Wirikuta, the visionary communication with the cosmic realms will be severed; as such, from their perspective, trampling the lands is akin to gouging out the world's eyes. The shamans and indigenous people have been the keepers of this powerful consciousness, respecting the peyote that grows on the land and performing their rituals.

The Convención Metropolitana de Artistas y Trabajadores de la Cultura (CMATC), a collective born out of the Zapatista uprising and resistance in 1994, organized five artist collectives from around México to produce a series of visual art and text in defense of Wirikuta. All the funds from CMATC's sales go directly to the resistance movement. Among the participating collectives is Oaxaca-based ASARO. The accompanying DVD-R contains photos of the artwork, the artists, and a Wirikuta pilgrimage. The accompanying CD-ROM contains PDF files of the five Spanish texts in the work and translations into English and French. This copy is part of a limited run of 75, most of which are no longer in circulation.

Emiliano Zapata's image has become globally recognized through its prolific reproduction, used primarily to represent the political and social fight for freedom for marginalized peoples. This book, featuring a collection of 16 prints, aims to visually explore Zapatismo beyond the iconic image, examining the relationships between farming land, the environment, and community. The book also explores the political thoughts of Subcommandante Marcos, the Plan of Ayala, and Zapatismo during the Mexican Revolution. It also includes a handkerchief and a one-liter bottle of a particular Mezcal, rumored to have been Zapata's favorite. Each print in the collection has been signed and numbered. This copy is number seven in a limited run of 32.

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

This book contains 17 engravings made using carborundum and sugar lift an intaglio printmaking technique – on 300-gram white Velin d'ARCHES paper, measuring 28 x 38 centimeters. The work, created between October and December 1991 in the Ediciones Multiarte workshops, was highly collaborative; the main artists were Eduardo Matos Moctezuma and Patricia Ouintana, who operated under the direction of Enrique Cattaneo, the technical direction of Marcela Lobo, and the coordination of Isaac Masri. It was originally conceived of and designed by Raymundo Sesma. The typography was made in 18-point Bodoni type in the Imprenta Madero workshops by Antonio Gonzalez. Graciela Limon Lason revised the texts. Other contributors included: Aurelia Salinas, Marcela Reves, and Rafael Olver. The edition consists of 125 signed and numbered copies, distributed as follows: 99 copies numbered 1/99 to 99/99, ten copies numbered I P.A. to X P.A., ten copies numbered I H.C. to X H.C., four copies numbered I P.T. to IV P.T., one copy P.E., one copy Bon a Tirer, with an additional five suites of the engravings.

This copy is number 82 out of 99 (written in pencil) and is signed by Sesma.Rare. There is only one copy on Worldcat, at Stanford University. The binding consists of loose gatherings in black and yellow decorated paper wrapper, held within green and white decorated paper and a black cloth box with three wooden feet and one black marble flint blade, which is designed to pierce through an oblong hole cut through the box and the pages.

20. Superstitions Vol. 1 Multiple artists



This is a collection of 47 prints that revolve around the theme of superstition. These works – made with watercolor, paper, ink, and linocut techniques -- are divided into two parts: those that illustrate the benefits of cultural and traditional superstitions, and those that reinterpret and criticize those traditions. The former group explores the positive side of superstitions, illustrating how they're perceived as a way to elicit and encourage good luck in health, wealth, and love, and protect against negative outcomes. The latter group explores the negative side of superstitions and what happens when people apply logic and critical thinking to a tradition based on faith, fear, and hope. These artists critically confront perceived lapses in logic, reality, truth, and fact; they also examine how these concepts are used to manipulate and exploit the uneducated populace, bringing a personal and anecdotal narrative to their expositions. Together, both groups explore their experiences with superstitions with humor, sadness, annoyance, and acceptance.

The works examine the universality of water and how even though it is colorless and transparent, we see a world of reflections from our own world. Many of the artists also use imagery from the ancient world -- found in mythical tales and characters like Narcissus -- to further illustrate this reality, depicting waters that are alive with naiads and nymphs, and an existence in which mortals and immortals mingled and complicated each other's lives.



Through this work, the artists aim to honor the female healers, shamans, witches, and midwives who have given people sustenance and medicine since ancient times. These healers have preserved and passed down a valuable legacy and understanding of the power of plants, despite the process of colonization relentlessly attempting to erase this indigenous wisdom. Additionally, the work aims to make a statement on the role of women in graphics, showcasing the importance of their contributions. Featured artists include Abril Carpi, Alondra Benítez, Aura María Juárez, Arcelia Martín Del Campo Serrano, Cezylea Fractale, Diana Torres, Karla Pérez, Laura Makabra, Mafer Lázaro, Melisa Esteva, Nay Rivas, Paloma, Rebeca Jahmai, Rebeca Jiménez, Sandra Sofia Sánchez, Violeta Juárez, and Yokebed Islas.
