




#### 1. SANGRE "GRANA COCHINILLA"

Sixteen original relief prints inspired by the rich tradition of mezcal production in southern Mexico. Many traditional and 20th century motifs and images are utilized, drawing from pin-up artistic traditions to indigenous patterns. A coming together of the art of printmaking and design with the art and influence of mezcal. The artists include Alberto Cruz, Demian Lescas, Sebastian Fund, Felix Hernandez Monterozo, Shinzaburo Takeda, Aaron Lopez, Humberto Valdez, Bajo Los Efectos del Mezcal artists' collective and several others. Some of these Oaxaca based graphic artists were part of the Asaro collective. All art signed and numbered; edition of 50. Barón Wilhelm Friedrich von Karwinsky (1780-1855) fue un naturalista Alemán, Que Vivió en Oaxaca y estudio numerosas especies, entre ellas los Agaves que más tarde llevarían su nombre, Agaves Karwinskii es decir: Cuishe, Madrecuishe y Tobaziche. Willem Friederich fue enviado a México en 1826, por la Sociedad Minera Germano- Americana de Dusseldorf y por el gobierno bávaro para hacer colecciones de objetos de Historia Natural. Permaneció cinco años, principalmente en Oaxaca, y envió a su país un número considerable de plantas vivas (especialmente Cactáceas y Agaves). En 1840 visitó otra vez México por cuenta del gobierno Ruso, con el mismo objeto, regresando á Munich en 1843, mientras que sus colecciones fueron enviadas a San Petersburgo. An extensive art portfolio produced in solidarity with anti-mining activism organized around attempts to seize lands held sacred by the Huichol people. The contested territory is in the Sierra De Catorce, in the Mexican state of San Luis Potosi. The Huicholes believe that if the mining companies invade the sacred lands of Wirikuta, the visionary communication with the cosmic realms will be severed and that trampling the peyote lands will literally gouge out the world's eyes. The shamans and indigenous people have been the keepers of this powerful consciousness, respecting the peyote and performing their rituals. The Convención Metropolitana de Artistas y Trabajadores de la Cultura (CMATC), a collective born out of the Zapatista uprising and resistance in 1994, has organized 5 artist collectives from around México to produce a series of visual art and text in defense of Wirikuta. All of the funds from CMATC's sales go directly to the resistance movement. Among the participating collectives is Oaxaca-based ASARO. The accompanying DVD-R contains photos of the artwork, the artists and a Wirikuta pilgrimage. The accompanying CD-ROM contains PDF files of the 5 Spanish texts and translations into English and French. Limited to 75 copies, 40 of which are out of commerce and reserved for participants. 

Includes art by Elias Urias, Salvador Castro, Andres Ordaz, Martha Franco, Josue Abisai Martinez, Isaac Ruiz Sanchez and many others. All prints are signed in an edition of 100. The project was a roaming exhibition that went to Puebla, Oaxaca, Zacatecas and increased until 102 works were exhibited.
