Twelve prints by twelve artists on the theme of night, moonlight, and darkness. The artists play with the printmaking technique to create subtle, but nuanced, nighttime scenes. The fine printing sensibility is a marked departure from the typical output of this art collective, which tends to channel the revolutionary spirit and social commentary found in much 20th century Mexican printing. A poetic preface is printed on a vellum transparency. The clamshell is made entirely of corrugated cardboard, and has a relief print illustration on the front.
